They recently provided chair massages to staff members and mothers participating in a wellness fair organized by Healthy Mothers / Healthy Babies in Ft. Lauderdale on December 1, 2006.

The daytime massage students provided table and chair massages to patrons attending the Touch A Heart Foundation event in Southwest Ranches on December 4, 2006. The Touch A Heart Foundation works with the Pediatric Transplant Unit at Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami, Conine's Clubhouse at Memorial Hospital in Hollywood, and a few other organizations. This is the second year for students to be involved with this organization.

Mr. Boggs, massage therapy program coordinator, was contacted by a very

high end training facility looking to have 4 or 5 students serve as massage externs to work with athletes during six weeks of strenuous training in preparation for the upcoming National Football League (NFL) scouting combine. SECURITY TIP 1. During this season, make certain when executing sensitive transactions the address portion of your favorite browser displays HTTPS rather than HTTP. The additional S signifies that your data is encrypted (scrambled) and less vulnerable. *You may see this when accessing email etc.*
SECURITY TIP 2. Replace your current password with an easily remembered phrase such as: ILIKE2EATGREEN-TOMATOES. (*I like to eat green tomatoes*) The length and complexity makes it relatively impervious to less sophisticated attacks.
